
OY VEY...AIR CURTAINS AND RESTAURANTS

Location Location Location. The adage doesn't just apply to a physical address.

So when customers were requesting seats located as far from the front door as possible, the owner of Vey's Pub and Grille knew something had to be done. **The problem?** Each time a person came in, they were accompanied by bursts of cold air, insects and leaves that piled up outside the door. The tables near the entrance were constantly empty, with people choosing to wait rather than sit near the door. This resulted in lost revenue, decreased satisfaction and a constant battle against the elements.



THE AIR CURTAIN SOLUTION



Unfortunately, this is a common problem for restaurants. Excessive cold. Oppressive heat. Insects. Dust. These pesky problems are happy to enter your restaurant along with patrons looking to enjoy a good meal, without battling the elements.

On top of the revenue loss resulting from an empty table, it can also cause your HVAC system to work harder, increasing your energy bills. **Fortunately there is an easy, effective and affordable solution.** Air Curtains can be incorporated into almost any doorway.

NO ROOM? NO PROBLEM

One of the most common misconceptions we hear is, "I need an air curtain, I would benefit from an air curtain, but I don't think I have the right space." Quite simply, that's rarely the case. Air curtains can be installed in a number of ways with threaded rod and/or mounting brackets being the most common and versatile methods. The owner of Vey's feared a 20' ceiling and inset glass façade would prevent an air curtain from being installed. In less than an hour, the threaded rod was measured, cut and dropped from the ceiling, easily managing the 20 feet.

- 1 Installing struts to overhead framing & joists
- Measuring and cutting threaded rod to size
- Installing threaded rod to struts
- Attach Air Curtain to threaded rod and level









The End Result

Within two hours, a heated air curtain was installed and running at Vey's. A thermostat and door switch were added to help maximize the effectiveness of the air curtain, which instantly began creating a thermal barrier to block outside air.

After experiencing the challenges of not having an air curtain, Tom Ristvey, the owner and operator at Vey's, had the following comments, "You could tell when our bar and grill started filling up. You'd feel bursts of cold air and notice people migrating away from the door. With the addition of the air curtain, the cold air (as well as the leaves) stopped entering alongside customers. We were able to utilize the tables located near the door and could maximize the space that was previously unusable. It was a decision I wish I had made sooner!"
